rather inexpensive modifications, be converted to run on water. There are methods of harnessing the earth's own energy to convert to electricity. These are all environmentally friendly, non-polluting and inexpensive forms of energy.

It may take, say, 2 years to get this technology to a commercial level, but in the case of cars, in the meantime, we can get them to do 100 mpg (whatever that is in kms per litre) or more. The technology to achieve this has also been suppressed for 70 years. It simply requires modification of the carburetor to create a more efficient, cleaner burn.


